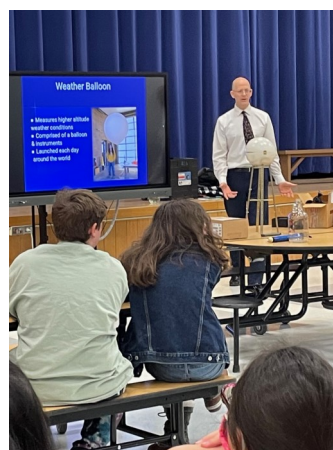
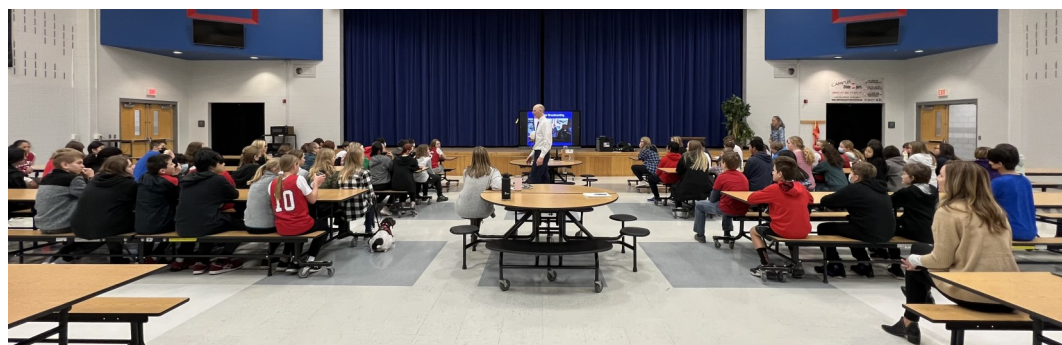

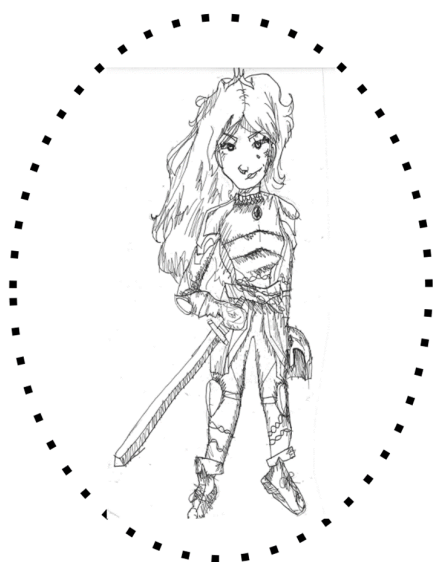


Horace Mann Spelling Bee 2022

Parents and eighth graders, it is time to begin thinking about high school course registration. Below are some important dates and activities that will assist both parents and students in this important process.

Registration Information for Current 7th Graders:

Hello Middle School Parents/Guardians!

As we approach registration, we want to make sure that you have any and all essential information necessary when planning your student's future course selections at East.

We are fortunate to be able to offer International Baccalaureate (IB) classes along with a **full International Baccalaureate diploma**. The IB is a program of courses and examinations offered at schools all over the world. This advanced program allows students to explore subjects in great depth, helping them to prepare for college work. Perhaps the greatest benefit of the IB program is that it offers the students accelerated subject matter and intense university preparation that is recognized worldwide. Students may graduate with individual certificates for each IB class taken that may translate into college credit at many universities, or they may earn an IB Diploma which may mean sophomore recognition at many universities around the world.

One component of this program is instilling a global perspective. As a result, IB has a language requirement. In order to meet the IB language requirement, students need to begin their language study in the 8th grade. Both Junior and Senior year at the high school level are required for the IB diploma. Students who begin language study in 9th grade are not eligible as they are only able to complete one year of the required two-year course. Additionally, students may not start in one language and change to another language so students should choose the language that interests them.

Wausau School District Parents/Guardians and Staff:

We want to make you aware of a change as it relates to masking when there's a COVID-19 case in a classroom. Starting today, January 21, 2022, students will only need to wear a mask for 5 days from the last date of contact with the positive student, not 10 days. We understand that may create some questions for families of students who are wearing masks right now. Please know, your child's principal will be reaching out to you with an update on how to proceed, if they haven't already.

As always, please monitor your child and get them tested for COVID-19 if they show any of the following symptoms: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, nausea/vomiting, diarrhea, and/or sore throat. Reach out to your family doctor with any questions or concerns regarding symptoms.

Please notify your child's school nurse or health aide if your child tests positive for COVID-19. Notify any person who was in close contact with your child (within 6 feet of the child for 15 cumulative minutes in 24 hours.) The close contact should monitor for symptoms and get tested 3-5 days after exposure.

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WSD COVID GUIDELINES 21-22

Students must stay home from school if they have the following symptoms.

- If a student has symptoms, it is recommended that they immediately be tested for COVID, regardless of vaccine status.
- **The symptomatic student may return to school with proof of a negative rapid or PCR COVID test from a medical facility** (not a home test) or an alternate diagnosis from a medical practitioner. (Proof may be an email, text, or paper copy.) If a student returns to school without proof of a negative test, the student will be sent home.
- ***New guidance: If a student tests positive for COVID, the child must stay home and isolate for 5 days from the COVID test date** . The student must also be fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication, and have improvement of symptoms before returning to school. **The student must wear a mask for 5 days after the isolation period ends.** (Ten days total isolation plus masking.)
- **If parents choose not to have their symptomatic child tested, the student is presumed positive and must stay home and isolate for 5 days from symptom onset.** The student must also be fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication, and have improvement of symptoms before returning to school. **The student must wear a mask for 5 days after the isolation period ends.**
- Parents are asked to notify the school if a student develops symptoms or tests positive for COVID. A positive home test will be accepted. A lab verified test is strongly recommended.
- Parents may choose to quarantine the siblings of a positive student in the home or classroom, based on the health department recommendation, and the absence will be excused.
