7th Grade Boys Basketball Season Summary

Congratulations to the 7th grade boys basketball teams for having a fantastic season this fall! The A team started the year rough, losing their first three games, but then went on to win 7 of their next 8 games before losing their season finale. They ended with a record of 7-5. The B team ended the year 3-8 but several of their losses came to teams that were playing several A team players. The B team enjoyed and were effective with pressing during the second half of games; with highlights of the season being a come from behind win against PJ Jacobs and almost coming from behind to beat Wisconsin Rapids.

The leading scorers for the A team were Maddox Hurtis with 12, Elijah DeMoss with 10, and Xander Klein with 8 points per game. The leading scorers for the B team were Grayson Best and Jackson Gumbert who averaged 10 and 5 points per game respectively. Both teams developed good habits throughout the season including excellent attendance at practices and games; working hard and being focused in practice, being enthusiastic and supportive of each other; gaining experience and learning how to compete; and once the season started the boys collectively maintained their grades in school.

Registration Information for Current 7th Graders:

Hello Middle School Parents/Guardians!

As we approach registration, we want to make sure that you have any and all essential information necessary when planning your student's future course selections at East.

We are fortunate to be able to offer International Baccalaureate (IB) classes along with a **full International Baccalaureate diploma**. The IB is a program of courses and examinations offered at schools all over the world. This advanced program allows students to explore subjects in great depth, helping them to prepare for college work. Perhaps the greatest benefit of the IB program is that it offers the students accelerated subject matter and intense university preparation that is recognized worldwide. Students may graduate with individual certificates for each IB class taken that may translate into college credit at many universities, or they may earn an IB Diploma which may mean sophomore recognition at many universities around the world.

One component of this program is instilling a global perspective. As a result, IB has a language requirement. In order to meet the IB language requirement, students need to begin their language study in the 8th grade. Both Junior and Senior year at the high school level are required for the IB diploma. Students who begin language study in 9th grade are not eligible as they are only able to complete one year of the required two-year course. Additionally, students may not start in one language and change to another language so students should choose the language that interests them.

Students must stay home from school if they have the following symptoms.

- If a student has symptoms, it is recommended that they immediately be tested for COVID, regardless of vaccine status.
- The symptomatic student may return to school with proof of a negative rapid or PCR COVID test from a medical facility (not a home test) or an alternate diagnosis from a medical practitioner. (Proof may be an email, text, or paper copy.) If a student returns to school without proof of a negative test, the student will be sent home.
- * New guidance from the CDC: If a student tests positive for COVID, the child must stay home and isolate for 5 days from the COVID test date. The student must also be fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication, and have improvement of symptoms before returning to school. The student must wear a mask for 5 days after the isolation period ends. (Ten days total isolation plus masking.)
- If parents choose not to have their symptomatic child tested, the student is presumed positive and must stay home for 10 days, be fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication, and have improvement of symptoms before returning to school.

Return date: _____

- Parents are asked to notify the school if a student develops symptoms or tests positive for COVID. A positive home test will be accepted. A lab verified test is strongly recommended.
- Parents may choose to quarantine the siblings of a positive student in the home, based on the health department recommendation, and the absence will be excused.
- If your child is identified as a close contact by the health department, follow the directions from the health department.

(La prueba puede ser un correo electrónico, un mensaje de texto o una copia impresa). Si un estudiante regresa a la escuela sin una prueba de una prueba negativa, el estudiante será enviado a casa.
