

# Safety Corner

As you may recall, over the past several months we have been activating our new school safety plan -- ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate). For the past few years, we have been preparing our students and staff for this change by having conversations with them about possible situations and how to respond. The purpose of these drills is to provide students and staff with the opportunity to plan ahead by making a well-informed decision if an unsafe and/or unexpected situation were to happen at school.

Our next step in ALICE is to have an Evacuation drill to the Wausau East Softball Fields Parking Lot. This evacuation location has been selected with great consideration to ensure the safety of our students. On February 24th, we will conduct an evacuation point drill. During this drill teachers and staff will be expected to formulate a plan with the students to ensure everyone's safety. Their plans should consist of: discussion of their rally point route, where and how to safely transition to the evacuation site, what materials to take with them (coat, boots, and hats), and expectations for remaining calm and orderly at the evacuation site.

**Prior to February 24th**, we hope that all families can have a conversation about our school's safety plan and safety drill. Please remember this is a drill and the purpose is to provide students and staff with the opportunity to plan ahead by making a well-informed decision if an unsafe and/or unexpected situation were to happen at school. **Students should dress for winter weather and have hats, gloves, boots and jackets for the evacuation drill.**





## WHAT DOES THIS REFERENDUM COST ME?

If approved, this \$119,800,000 referendum would have an estimated property tax impact of negative \$0.43 on every \$1,000 of property value in the Wausau School District. That means, the owner of a home valued at \$150,000 would see an annual tax reduction of about \$64.50.

## HOW DID WE GET HERE?

The Board of Education's proposed solution has been created based on the input and feedback of the community. This effort included online surveys for community and staff members, three community engagement sessions, staff listening sessions at all schools and engagement on social media. The District and the Board have also communicated and gathered feedback through a facility needs webpage and via the local media.

- If a student has symptoms, it is recommended that they immediately be tested for COVID, regardless of vaccine status.
- **The symptomatic student may return to school with proof of a negative rapid or PCR COVID test from a medical facility** (not a home test) or an alternate diagnosis from a medical practitioner. (Proof may be an email, text, or paper copy.) If a student returns to school without proof of a negative test, the student will be sent home.
- **\*New guidance: If a student tests positive for COVID, the child must stay home and isolate for 5 days from the COVID test date** . The student must also be fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication, and have improvement of symptoms before returning to school. **The student must wear a mask for 5 days after the isolation period ends.** (Ten days total isolation plus masking.)
- **If parents choose not to have their symptomatic child tested, the student is presumed positive and must stay home and isolate for 5 days from symptom onset.** The student must also be fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication, and have improvement of symptoms before returning to school. **The student must wear a mask for 5 days after the isolation period ends.**
- Parents are asked to notify the school if a student develops symptoms or tests positive for COVID. A positive home test will be accepted. A lab verified test is strongly recommended.
- Parents may choose to quarantine the siblings of a positive student in the home or classroom, based on the health department recommendation, and the absence will be excused.
